



Clinical Track Faculty Position – Assistant Professor Pharmaceutical Compounding

The University of Utah, College of Pharmacy is seeking nominations and applications for a clinical track faculty member who has expertise in pharmaceutical compounding. This half-time clinical track position will be at the rank of Assistant Professor and is currently available.

The applicant should hold a baccalaureate, with an advanced degree highly desired, or Pharm.D. degree. The applicant should have the ability to compound a variety of pharmaceutical products in the community and institutional pharmacy settings. The applicant should have a working knowledge of USP 795 and 797. Pharmacy licensure or eligibility for licensure in Utah is required.

Responsibilities of the positions are summarized below:

Teaching: The faculty member will teach biopharmaceutics and compounding principles and skills in several courses in the didactic curriculum of the College of Pharmacy and will coordinate 1 course in pharmaceutical compounding.

Scholarship: Faculty are expected to participate in producing scholarly works, which may include clinical research, outcomes research, review articles, book chapters, and case reports. Presentations at local, regional, and national meetings are expected. The dynamic practice setting of the University Health Care System will provide numerous opportunities for collaborative clinical and outcomes research with the Department.

Service: Participation on college, departmental, and hospital committees is expected. In addition, faculty members serve as advisors to student organizations, and are expected to be active in local and national professional service.

Practice/Outreach: Participation in compounding activities directed towards college recruitment of high school students to the profession of pharmacy is required.

Salary is commensurate with experience. Review of applications will begin immediately and will continue until the position is filled.
